

IEPA15 Author Declaration and Publication Permission

- The International Early Intervention and Prevention in Mental Health Association (IEPA) requires disclosure of the existence of ANY AND ALL significant financial interest(s) or other affiliation(s) a presenter has with the commercial supporter(s) of these education activities, and/or with the manufacturer(s) of ANY AND ALL commercial product(s) and/or provider(s) of ANY AND ALL commercial service(s) discussed in the scientific program. The existence of such relationships does not necessarily constitute a conflict of interest, but the prospective audience must be informed of the presenter's affiliation with every commercial support and an acknowledgment in the printed program and verbal or visual disclosure to participants at the session (disclosure by slide or overhead is required if AV equipment is used for the presentation). This policy is intended to openly identify any potential conflict(s) so that members of the audience in an educational activity can form their own judgements about the presentation. The IEPA also requires verbal disclosure of discussion of unlabeled uses of a commercial product or investigational use of a product not yet approved for this purpose. A reasonable test to guide decisions about what to disclose is whether any affiliation could cause embarrassment to the individual or institution involved, or lead to questions about the presenter's motives, if such affiliation(s) were made known to the general public.
- If any of the authors have any commercial interests or associations that might pose a conflict of interest regarding this submission, they must be declared. If accepted for presentation, the commercial interest or association must be declared on the title slide or the slide immediately following the title slide.
- Submission of the abstract constitutes the consent of all authors to publication (e.g., on the conference website, electronic newsletters, programs, social media, in a Wiley *Early Intervention in Psychiatry Journal* supplement online book of abstracts etc.)
- All authors hereby grant permission to film or photograph their presentation at the Conference.
- All individuals who contributed are listed and all authors listed have actually contributed to the article.
- Neither you nor any co-author has granted exclusive rights to, or transferred their copyright in, any version of the Contribution to any third party.
- You have obtained written permission from the copyright owners to reproduce any material owned by third parties, and that you have included appropriate acknowledgement within the text of your contribution.
- The contribution contains no libellous or unlawful statements, does not infringe upon the rights or the privacy of others, and does not contain any material or instructions that might cause harm or injury.
- Neither you or any of the co-authors appears on a sanctions list or is in violation of any government and/or international sanctions.
- All abstracts submitted must be your and all co-author's original work original work. The contribution is submitted only to the specified journal and has not been published. Abstracts previously presented will not be accepted.
- The Submitter confirms that these disclosure and publication permissions have been explained and the submission has been approved by all co-authors. You have informed your co-authors of the terms of the agreement and obtained their permission in writing to enter into it on their behalf. Wiley provides a [template letter](#), if needed, in which the co-author can acknowledge that they agree to the terms of the agreement you are executing.

- All abstracts must be submitted in English and via this online submission site, in final form and ready for publication in the Online Abstract Book. Your submission will NOT be reviewed for typos or other errors. Other forms of submission e.g., by post, email or fax will NOT be accepted.
- The abstract will be reviewed by members of the IEPA15 conference Scientific Committee and assessed on the results, interest and the merit of the study or project as presented in the abstract. If there is insufficient clarity in the abstract, then the abstract may be rejected. The Committee's decision is final.
- It is required that at least one co-author per accepted abstract (i.e., the presenting author) registers for the conference. We require registration of the presenting author by the close of early bird registration to have the contribution included in the final program and listed in the online abstract book.
- The authors will immediately notify the Conference Organiser if they are unable to present an abstract or if the presenting author changes.
- The acceptance of an abstract for the Conference does not imply provision of travel, accommodation or registration for the Conference, nor any other costs associated with preparation or presentation of the abstract, or any costs associated with attendance at the Conference.
